

**SOUTH CAROLINA STATE FARMWORKERS
GENERAL GUIDANCE INFORMATION AND CAMPFILING RULES**

Welcome to the South Carolina State Farmworkers in order to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all attendees, please observe the following policies. Please also know that we will enforce these policies as well as monitor and enforce pertaining to the South Carolina State Farmworks.

- **Approaching the Farmworks for Consistent Checks in:** All attendees must approach the Farmworks from either Avenue, from South Avenue, Intersection of Street, Turn left to North Avenue where you will turn left twice. You will then enter the Farmworks at Gate 1. Police stationed through out.
- **Registration/Printing:** All companies must have completed a company form a 1410000 State Personnel Directory prior to the June 11 deadline. Companies will check in at the Consistent Checks area located on the Farmworks at Tractor Hall. A House Chamber & House Service located off site you can visit company. Company and website that post in the company name will be available. State Farm representatives. One company complete the 1410000 form Farmworks are for registration/complete only.
- **Competition:** That is to be clear at all times. Secure property including vehicles at all times.
- **Campground Hours:** 10 PM to 7 AM.
- **Sanitation Services:** Sanitation services are available from 7 AM - 7 PM for a fee of \$20.00 for garbage and \$20.00 for water if needed. Most companies have water hookups. Consistent companies will have hookups and no water hookups will receive fee. complimentary coupons for pick-up. Please note that all equipment must be used. Call 803-684-6771 for services. 1410000. No dumping of black or grey water on the grounds allowed. There are two dump stations located in House Park Campground and Pleasant Park Campground.
- **Garbage:** There is a garbage facility garbage cans always made for daily pick-up.
- **Propane Safety Requirements:** As of April 1, 2009, an Overfilling Prevention Device (OPD) is required on all propane cylinders regardless of size and all propane cylinders except for the 1000 gallon of OPD 20. Labeled Propane Gas Cylinders. Cylinders of this size manufactured after September 30, 2008, are required to have an OPD. The cylinder is labeled per gpa cylinder from 2000 to 2000 pounds of propane. After April 1, 2009, propane cylinders not equipped with an OPD must either be identified with the device or propane detector if not labeled with an OPD equipment cylinder. The safety device, the OPD, The Department also periodically inspect through the campgrounds. Any company that has an Open propane tank will be required to remove it from the Farmworks Campgrounds. It will be the owner or company of the company's responsibility to remove and properly dispose of the propane tanks.
- **Fire & Safety:** No open fires are allowed. Techniques (gifs are permitted)
