## NHSRA Adds More Money to the 2021 NJHFR and NHSFR

The NHSRA's vote is to add \$100,000 and allocate accordingly to each finals rodeo.

**Denver, Colorado** | **February 5, 2021** - Each year, the National High School Rodeo Association executive board, national directors and staff meet to discuss and plan the future of the NHSRA during the Association's annual Mid-Winter Meeting. After careful consideration and discussions during the meeting, the NHSRA is proud to announce it will add more money to each event, which will benefit National Junior High and High School finals competitors.

The optional jackpot has been present at the finals for 30 plus years. Things changed in 2019 when the NHSRA voted to add \$150,000 to the optional jackpots allocating \$50,000 to the National Junior High Finals Rodeo [NJHFR] and \$100,000 to National High School Finals Rodeo [NHSFR] with hopes to reward competitors for their hard work and dedication. The NHSRA's vote is to add \$100,000 and allocate accordingly to each finals rodeo. The NJHFR was at \$50,000 and will now increase to \$100,000. The National High School Finals Rodeo NHSFR was sitting at \$100,000 and will be raised to \$150,000. This optional jackpot is a side pot for competitors to enter at the NJHFR and NHSFR. It is currently \$75 per event for NJHFR contestants to enter and \$150 per event for NHSFR contestants to enter. It pays back a total of 80%, split 20% in the first go, second go, short go and for the average; the remaining 20% covers NHSRA expenses to host the events.

Both prestigious events have seen great payouts back to its competitors from the optional jackpot. In previous years, contestants have earned approximately \$4,000 to \$7,000 by entering the optional jackpot.

"We are excited to give these kids a bigger purse to compete for," said NHSRA Executive Director James Higginbotham. "They give so much all year, and this is just another chance for them to be rewarded. This will not affect the main goal of high school rodeo, which is to promote rodeo and education by awarding scholarships. We will still continue to award nearly \$2 million in scholarships annually."
